creativity & innovation week

Creativity and Innovation week is celebrated internationally and is a movement dedicated to celebrating creativity in the many forms that it comes in. This week's program will combine artistic concepts and processes, engineering, design, and history to engage the children's imagination and creativity as we foster their developing critical thinking and decision making through play and expression.



Monday 15th April

The Science of Art

PENDULUM ART

Using everyday objects the children will be challenged to design a pendulum frame that will combine STEM with art to explore elliptical movement and the patterns and imagery that can be created.

DIY SPIN ART

Explore movement through art as the children create wonderful patterns with paint and a repurposed salad spinner.

FOOD SCIENCE DAYS

The children will combine science and cooking as they explore a range of scientific methods and concepts. From colour free rainbow candy, multipurpose rice paper and hot Ice cream the children will love this introduction to food chemistry.

Junior Engineers

LETS TINKER

The children will learn more about how everyday machines work as they pull apart, deconstruct and reassemble a range of recycled technologies and objects.

LANDMARK ENGINEERING

Using just a little glue, paddle pop sticks and some foundation engineering the children will be challenged to construct their interpretations of some famous Australian Landmarks.

INCURSION: PALLET PLAY

The children will explore sustainability and fundamental woodworking skills as they construct a new piece of furniture using the Pallet Plays Build-it Box program.

SOLAR POWERED EXPERIMENTS

The children will be exploring the power of the sun as they compete against the other schools to design and construct their own solar powered creations.

HOVER CRAFT RACES

The power of air will be explored as the children construct their own hovercrafts to race.

BLUE POLES SPLATTER ART

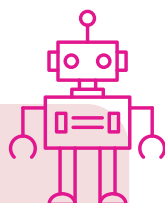
Taking inspiration from the famous painting the children will create their own splatter art creations.

BOOT CAMP

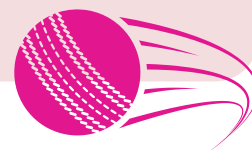
The children and educators will design and construct their own bootcamp using a range of sport resources.

WREATH MAKING

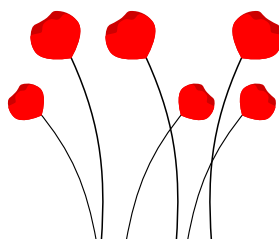
In recognition of ANZAC Day the children will collaborate on creating a wreath that will be taken to the War Memorial as the children pay their respects to the men and women of the armed forces.
